In 2024, one of the fortunate grant recipients was Morgan Elementary, which received support for their Outdoor Learning initiative. This project includes the creation of a pollinator/butterfly garden and an outdoor classroom which is expected to be completed later this year. Designed by White Oak Garden Center, the garden will offer students hands-on experiences with life cycles and native plants. The outdoor classroom will feature benches arranged in a miniature amphitheater, providing an immersive learning environment. This initiative will engage students and community members alike, fostering a deeper connection to nature and outdoor education.
